## Recognitions & Resolutions

- Trustees recognized the 2017-2018 members of the SAISD Student Advisory Committee. The purpose of this Committee is to provide student input on educational issues to the Board and Superintendent. The Committee is composed of one student representative from each of the 12 high schools. The Committee selects topics to discuss throughout the school year and meets with the Board and Superintendent monthly. The students provide feedback on these topics as well as a report on the responses from their peers. This year's Student Advisory Committee consisted of the following students. - The Board recognized students from Fox Tech HS, Young Women's Leadership Academy, and Bonham Academy for participating in the Texas State History Day competition on April 28, 2018. All students placed either first or second in their project category at the San Antonio Regional History Day in February after placing first or second at the SAISD History Day in December 2017. National History Day is a nonprofit organization that conducts a yearlong program that requires students to advance through a series of competitions at the local, regional, state, and national levels. In order to participate in the National History Day series of competitions, students created a project linked to this year's contest theme, "Conflict and Compromise in History." Students chose a specific topic in line with this theme, engaged in deep research using both primary and secondary sources, and created a project selected from five categories: performance, documentary, paper, website, or exhibit. SAISD students participated in the Texas State History Day competition in the performance, paper, and website categories.  Trustees recognized SAISD's JROTC students for their achievements at the United States Army Cadet Command National Drill Team Championship held in Louisville, Kentucky on April 14, 2018 and the All Service Drill Team National Championship held in Daytona Beach on May 4, 2018. JROTC groups honored included Brackenridge, Highlands and Jefferson high schools.

#### SAISD 2018-2019 Budget Update

The Board received a presentation on the 2018-2019 budget from Larry Garza, Associate Superintendent of Financial Services and Business Operations. This budget update provided insight on a projected decline in student membership for 2018-2019 and the expected impact to state revenue. The presentation also showed the number of teachers that will be displaced due to schools with declining enrollment or program changes. The District will manage the projected revenue decline with full consideration of the potential impact to employees, students, families, taxpayers, and the greater SAISD community. Included in the presentation was a report on the local property tax values, general fund balance, proposed I&S tax rate, debt service budget and child nutrition budget. The 2018-2019 General Fund Budget is scheduled for approval in June.

## Revisions to Board Policy Related to Open Enrollment Approved

The Board approved staff's recommendation of the addition of a "Choice Schools and Choice Programs" section to Board Policy FDB (LOCAL) in compliance with the Texas Education Code (TEC) and Texas Administrative Code (TAC) related to open enrollment. This section defines "Choice Schools" and "Choice Programs" and states that the Superintendent or designee will develop administrative procedures and regulations regarding them. While the District has guidelines in place for Choice Schools and Choice Programs, formal administrative procedures are currently in development.

# Two Solar-Powered Photo Murals at J.T. Brackenridge Approved

Trustees approved the installation of the two solar panels at J.T Brackenridge ES. By using a new technology, the solar panels will not appear as standard solar panels, but will instead look like two photo murals while generating electricity. These solar panels will be installed on the west wall façade of the school on Brazos Street. Each photo mural will be comprised of nine 60cell solar modules in a 3-ft by 3-ft composition. The solar modules will be connected to the school's electrical meter by South Texas Solar Systems, a certified solar installer. All equipment will be exterior mounted and no additional equipment will be placed in the electrical room of the school. Through student and community design workshops in April, the photos selected for the wall are a 1908 school photo of students and a current photo of the 75 students who took part in the workshops. These students are fifth-grade science students taught by Mr. Pablo Vegas. It is anticipated that the solar energy captured will provide 100 percent of the electricity to light up the existing photo-banners along Guadalupe Street. The photo-banners were installed in 2006 as part of the neighborhood photo exhibition, "En Aquellos Tiempos: Fotohistorias del Westside." These banners are currently not illuminated and are not very visible at night. As a standard building-integrated solar module installation, currently there is minimal maintenance. The murals will also be protected by the building eave. South Texas Solar Systems will ensure

the system is operating at peak efficiency and will resolve any issues that may arise with the power electronics or the solar modules. Plans will be reviewed and approved by the Construction Services Department ahead of installation, which is expected to begin in August 2018.
